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			Eligibility for residents in aged care:
			An individual is eligible if they are admitted to a public, private or NFP aged care facility.
			If an individual is on a Home Care Package- Level 1 or 2 they can receive funding if meet criteria.
			 If an individual is on a Home Care Package- Level 3 or 4 formerly known as Extended Aged Care at Home (EACH) package or an Extended Aged Care at Home Dementia (EACH D) package, and their care plan includes continence aids. They cannot receive funding and the aged care facility receives ACFI funding for continence management.
			What about state /territory schemes?
			If a person is eligible for the CAPS, and is currently receiving assistance with continence (or continence related) products through a state or territory government funded scheme, they should contact their scheme manager to find out if the assistance will be affected by their eligibility for the CAPS.
			How do I apply?
			Complete a CAPS application form.
			A health professional must complete the Health Report component in the form.
			There is a list of Neurological conditions that are only accepted.
			Post/ Fax form to Medicare Australia.
			• Applicant can elect a "representative"- an Individual, Government department, Company (eg, relative, person with power of attorney, legal guardian, Centrelink or DVA representative) to completes applicant details, sign form, and can elect to receive the CAPS funding for individual, and enter company bank details, ABN. (CAPS application form lists guidelines & criteria for representative).
